Our ancestor, Daisy Griffin developed a reputation as a fine huntress, protecting the Oxen from marauding predators and providing game meat as they travelled the perilous journey through the African continent. When Roosevelt journeyed to East Africa on his first hunt, Daisy was there to greet him as he crossed the Great Ewaso Nyiro river.

Robin's father, Lt Col Roger Hurt D.S.O., continued the family legacy as a Game Warden in Kenya in the early 1900's. As a teenager Robin Hurt assisted his father with game cropping and problem animal control, gaining experience and a passion for hunting and adventure.

Robin Hurt was first licensed as a professional hunter in 1963 and over the past sixty years he has guided safaris across the finest game fields of Africa.

Following in the family tradition, Robin has passed down his passion and knowledge to his sons, Derek and Roger. They both started hunting in their early childhoods, growing up on safari in the African bush. Derek and Roger have been involved in the family business for the past few decades guiding hunts across Africa, before taking over the running of the company when Robin moved to Namibia.














Lake Natron South The very heart of Masailand

Situated in the heart of Masailand, Lake Natron South sits on the floor of the Great Rift Valley. It is surrounded by volcanic Mountains including the famous active volcano named Oldonyo Lengai, "The Mountain of God," by the Masai.

An area of breathtaking scenery, the camp is in the foothills of Kitumbeini mountain, overlooking the Masai plains, Oldonyo Lengai and the Ngorongoro Highlands.

The habitat varies tremendously from open plains and arid woodland to acaciabrush country and the mountain forests stretching from 7000 to 9500 feet on Kitumbeini mountain, providing habitat for a huge variety of species.

This area is the number one destination for the discerning sportsman looking to hunt a wide range of Masailand species, big leopard and buffalo in one safari.

The beautiful scenery and abundance of game also makes it the perfect location for non hunting guests looking for a one of a kind photographic experience.



Luganzo Game Reserve Tanzania's largest private wilderness

Luganzo borders the Ugalla Game Reserve and is the biggest hunting area in Tanzania (over two million acres). It encompasses Lake Sagara on its north western boundary and the Ugalla River on both its western and southern borders. The area consists of a mixture of vast open savannah flood plains, miombo woodland and flat-topped mountain escarpments.

Home to an incredible range of species due to its size, and having both riverine and miombo habitats. It is an excellent area for hunting East African Sitatunga, due to the large swamps along the edge of Lake Sagara and the Ugalla River, which provides perfect habitat for these elusive animals.

Many professional hunters say they have never been anywhere in Africa with such abundant populations of Sable and Roan antelope. The Ugalla is also famous for some of the largest crocodiles ever hunted in Africa, some of which have reached over 17 foot. Luganzo is Untamed Africa at its best.

Kitumbeine Mountain

A remote wilderness of foothills and valleys

Kitumbeine Mountain in an enormous, rugged mountain with a unique ecosystem. An extinct volcano sitting at an alititude of 2871m, it is one of the few places in the world where huge densities of cape buffalo roam in the 'mist forests' on top of the mountain. A mountain Buffalo hunt is the ultimate adventure hunt, the real deal.

It is also home to some of the most enormous mountain leopards found in Africa, as well as having excellent habitat for Greater Kudu, Eland, Masai Bushbuck, Bush pig and Mountain Reedbuck.

This is an adventure for the out-going and physically fit, as the entire hunt is done on foot (there are no cars involved). Days are spent hiking up and down steep inclines from the moment you leave camp at dawn, until returning at dusk.

This hunt appeals to those that love mountain hunting worldwide.



Rungwa Game Reserve A pristine big game hunting destination


The Rungwa Game Reserve is made up of 9,000 km², of pristine wilderness that borders the Ruaha National Park. It is prime country for Buffalo, Lion and Leopard, as well as large array of plains game.

The Rungwa Game Reserve is breathtakingly beautiful, with Miombo woodland interspersed with riverine valleys, open savannah plains and some spectacular granite rocky outcrops.

Rungwa is well known as the ultimate big game destination. Famous for its big lion populations.

The hunting season conincides with the dry season, at which time huge herds of buffalo migrate into the area from the park, attracted by the numerous springs and waterholes. It is Buffalo paradise, and as a result also attracts a large population of lion.





Part of the allure of Namibia is its huge variety in scenery, habitat and wildlife. It has four distinctly different landscapes; The Namib, The Central Plateau, The Kalahari Desert and Caprivi, each with its own characteristics and attractions. It is one of the least-densely populated countries on earth, with enormous tracts of wilderness throughout the country. Larger than Germany or Texas, Namibia has a population of only 2.5 million people; you can drive for hours without seeing a single human being.

The ruggedness of the Namibian landscape has done nothing to deter both flora and fauna from adapting and thriving. Here, the very act of survival can sometimes be an art. The sheer abundance and variety of wildlife of all sizes is staggering – with 217 species of mammals; 26 of which are endemic. Being home to such diversity makes Namibia the perfect safari destination for the whole family; both hunters and non-hunters alike.

Gamsberg & Mt. Barry Wilderness

Situated in the heart of Namibia, 126 kilometers South-West of Windhoek, you will find Gamsberg and the Mount Barry Wilderness. The ranch itself is over 55,000 acres with an incredible diversity of plains game species. Robin has created a conservancy with the surrounding landowners and now has hunting grounds in excess of 300,000 acres. There are no high fences, allowing the free movement of game between the plains, the adjoining mountains and an area called "The Badlands" - which is a large inaccessible wilderness that drops down to the Namib Desert.

At Gamsberg, you will be hosted by Robin & Pauline Hurt, and Dan & Jana Mousley. Accommodation is in the Hurt's spacious and relaxing family home, Gamsberg House - which has a spectacular views of Gamsberg Mountain. Individuals, groups of friends and families with children are all welcome.


